Trouble in Sacramento!

Governor Brown has terminated the appointment of Daphne Greene, who has served as Deputy Director of the OHV Division of State Parks effective January 1, 2012. Governor Jerry Brown's appointee has not yet been announced, but the decision could have long lasting negative effects for off road access, including the loss for family recreation throughout California at all the State Vehicle Recreation Areas (SVRA) located statewide. The State's OHMVR trust fund has been in peril since the state siphoned \$10 million received from the gas tax from its budget before it could reach the trust earlier this year, and plans for a continued removal of those funds will continue indefinitely.

The State has a long history of borrowing millions from the OHMVR trust every year, monies that are needed for acquisitions and improvements. The California OHMVR program's annual budget of \$85 million comes from primarily gas tax revenues with only about 20% coming from the Green/Red Sticker Program. With the loss of Daphne Greene - a longtime strong OHV ally - all the OHV programs - both the SVRA programs and the Grant Programs - stand to be eliminated. Jerry Brown has not been a supporter of any OHV programs and seeks to aide his ailing budget by closing the entire OHV programs.

#### WHAT CAN YOU DO?

- 1. Call, write or email your STATE Senator and Legislator immediately. Tell them how important the California Off Highway Vehicle programs are to you and your family. Mention the State facilities and areas that you use and how important they are to your family, or business if that applies.
- 2. Write, call or email Governor Jerry Brown with the same information. Express how Daphne Greene was a champion for the off road access community. (We will NOT change the fact that she has lost her job, but he may consider replacing her with someone who will look favorably on the OHV programs.)
- 3. Be prepared for CAL4WD and CORVA to lead a legal challenge in case we have to force the State to abide by the law, and keep the OHV programs going.

# **Tech report**

### Rescue tape

http://www.rescuetape.com/

**Rescue Tape** is a self-fusing silicone repair tape. First used by the US Military, the navy knows it as F4 tape easy-to. You can repair leaks on plumbing and hoses, use to insulate electrical wiring or as shrink wrap, wrap tool handles, and much, much more.

**Uses:** repair anything you can wrap tape around. The object does not need to be clean. Obviously if the object is clean then it can hold much more tightly. The rescue tape does not use adhesive it does not stick to the surface, the action of squeezing applies so much pressure to the object air, water or oil cannot leak out from under it. Use like a zip tie, it sticks to itself, .

**Users:** off road, motorcycle riders, fire engine operators, plumbers, equipment operators, operating scrapers, shot blasters, scarifiers, plaster pumps, etc.

**Repair** hydraulic leaks, gas lines, water pipe leaks, air leaks, vacuum hose; grout hose; protect power cord, batter cables, marine, underwater, engine compartments, good heat resistance 250°F, with a double wrap good up to 8,000 volts, un effected by oil, gas, hydraulic fluid, radiator coolant,

### **Rescue Tape Directions**

**Wrap** Rescue Tape around project by stretching (up to 3 x's) and overlapping onto itself. Stretch at least double up to 3x's to ensure a good bond; for high pressure leaks stretch to maximum amount. The tighter Rescue Tape is wrapped, the quicker and stronger the bond. The last wrap must be stuck to the previous wrap so that the corners at the end are not loose. Stretching activates the silicone although it will stick to itself by folding it over, without stretching it just takes a little longer.

Continue wrapping Rescue Tape around project by overlapping 50% onto itself so that ½ the width is covered with the next wrap. The first and last wrap should completely overlap onto the previous wrap for a complete bond (no loose corners). Additional layers may be necessary, and the same process should be used over the previous layers. Rescue Tape works on either side.

**Repositioning** Rescue Tape is only possible in the first few seconds after wrapping. Attempting to reposition Rescue Tape after 45 seconds or longer is not recommended. Rescue Tape is not reusable; however, additional Rescue Tape can be applied over project at any time in the future.

**For high pressure leaks**, additional wrapping may be required. Most hose repairs can be repaired with 3-5 layers in thickness, and wrapping 3 to 5 inches in each direction away from the leak; however, additional strength can be added

simply by wrapping more Rescue Tape.

Rescue Tape has essentially a "maximum" stretch. It is important to stretch Rescue Tape to its maximum to avoid having the leak create a bubble.

**For electrical wiring**, it is not necessary to stretch tightly. In fact, it will be more resilient to abrasion when it is not stretched as tightly.

# **Safety Report**

Safety administrator Danny Ward

When on the trail keep an eye out for the rig behind you. For groups larger than 10 there needs to be a 1) leader, 2) tail gunner and a 3) mid rig.

Basic safety equipment should include: first aid kit, fire extinguisher, CB radio, tow strap, extra food and water, basic tool kit, some spare parts, safety glasses, gloves, full size spare, working emergency brake.

Large Velcro straps are handy to keep your straps together.
