# **Run Reports**

## Rattlesnake Canyon – May 5

John almost made it there. Jesse got a phone call from John after breakfast stating that his jeep had to be towed home. So he does deserve a cow bell, but it was passed on. Had about 13 vehicles. Had one person get stuck, Brian, who was a visitor. Towards the top, at the rock garden, he got high-centered. The plan was for Mike and his three guests were going to do Motino Wash which is almost at the end, so they continued on. Per Mike, the wash is supposed to be the most rugged trail in the San Bernardino Mountains. Had 4 rigs and 2 ended up with damage. Mike would like to include it in as a run for next year and requires two lockers and 35's and even then there will likely be body damage. It's a 3½ mile to 4 mile stretch and it takes 3 to 4 hours. Mike put up a video on BigBearoffroadracing.com and has a link to a Youtube video of the trail. The other 9 continued on to the normal route onto Heartbreak Ridge. It was a long day. Went to a pizza place for dinner.

## Adopt-a-Trail – May 19

Had 5 vehicles, 6 people. Left at 9:00 and got to the trailhead about 10. Moved 5 or 6 trees that had fallen off the trail. There are still a few more trees that should be moved further. Pretty uneventful. The only casualty was a winch controller. It was put on a fender and was driven over. Was able to repair it and still need to test. Don encouraged everyone to go as it is really good time and good chance to use the equipment.

## Memorial Day Weekend

**Trail Leader Camping**: The trail leader will be camping at the **Grandview campground** July 12, 13 and 14. From Orange County go to the 15 Fwy and go north to US 395. Go north on US 395 to Big Pine. At Big Pine go east on SR 168 (13 miles) to bristlecone pine forest turn (White mtn. rd) and proceed 6 miles to the Grandview campground.

**Meeting Location:** Grandview Campground entrance located on White Mtn Rd. (there is no cell coverage at the meet spot)

**Meeting Time:** 8:30 am, plan is to leave for the trail at 9:00 am

**Trail Description:** The trail starts less then a mile from Grandview campground at 8600 ft elevation and runs about 7 miles down to hwy 168 at an elevation of 7200 ft. The trail is mostly a moderate level of difficulty with two difficult sections one has a by pass. The plan is to go down the trail to start and head over to the Mollie Evans mines area for lunch. After lunch we will head back to Old White Mtn. Rd and go back up to the Grandview Campground.

**Special Equipment Required:** 33" tires are recommended with at least one locker but body damage is possible. Stock Jeeps without lockers might have trouble and could experience body damage.

### **Campground Information:**

The **Grandview campground** has 27 campsites with tables, fire rings, central pit toilets but NO WATER. The max size for motorhomes is 23ft and the last 6 miles to the campground are steep, winding narrow mountain road. No reservations accepted and no fee only voluntary donations. The Grandview campground has large campsites that are spread out and can accommodate multiple vehicles and multiple tents.

**Glacier View campground** is located at the junction of US 395 and hwy 168 in Big Pine. Glacier view has 40 open tree shaded RV/tent sites on 20 acres. No reservations accepted.

There is also a campground in Bishop on hwy 395 that has drive through sites for larger motorhomes and trailers.

Group campsites are available by reservation only (760 873 2500) and are located on hwy 168 just before the turn off for Grandview campground. The group campsites are large with a pit toilet, covered eating area, a fire ring but NO WATER. These sites can accommodate RV's and tents.

There are **hotel accommodations** available in near by Big Pine and Bishop.

## **Create and Post a Run Announcement**

Message with the following information: Please use the words "Run Announcement" in the Subject line of the message, forward to the webmaster and newsletter editor to be copied and pasted.

- Date/Time and Place for the Run
- Description of Run
- Difficulty Rating scale 1 to 5
- Run Type: Base Camp, Day Run
- <u>Directions to Meeting Place.</u>
- EXACT Departure Time from Meeting Place
- Required Equipment. Open dif? Lockers?
- Is Special Equipment Required?
- Is RSVP Required?

- Are Permits Required? (Forest Adventure Pass etc.)
- CB Channel start with channel 4, if to much traffic on channel 4 then switch to 5 and so on.
- Camping Location/ Directions/ Details/ Facilities/ Fees. Access for motor homes? Very little ground clearance? Deep soft sand?
- Expected Weather Conditions.
- Contact Information (Leader Phone Number & email address)
- Please cover all the needed information in the Run Announcement rather than say "contact me for details".

## Start of the Run

- Hold brief driver's gathering before start of run. Include special instructions.
- Assign vehicle order if there are vehicles with open diffs. Have vehicle with locked diff in front & behind. (If possible disperse vehicles with HAM radios near the front, middle and rear of the line.
- Encourage drivers to learn the name of the person in front and behind his/her vehicle.
- Assign "Sweep Vehicle" (Tail Gunner Vehicle)
- Give 5 Minute Warning before start
- Begin Run ON TIME or notify everyone of new time.
- Announce Departure over CB channel 4
- Start moving slowly
- Stop at all turns to confirm vehicle behind sees turn
- Stop occasionally to close up ranks
- Announce comfort stops
- Announce Lunch Stop and Length of Stop

<u>After returning home</u> forward to *the webmaster and newsletter editor to be copied and pasted* a Run Report and a few photos. In the subject line write "Run Report"

The cow bell rules are: If you get stuck and are unable to move under your own power and need the help of a winch or you get strapped from one of your fellow jeepers then you have earned the privilege of hanging a cow bell from your front bumper. You must leave the cow bell on the front of your rig until another Dirt Devil gets stuck then, you can proudly hand it over.

# **Safety Report**

Safety administrator Danny Ward

When on the trail keep an eye out for the rig behind you.

Keep your fire extinguisher fresh. Shake it, you should feel the powder move around.

For groups larger than 10 there needs to be a 1) leader, 2) tail gunner and a 3) mid rig.

Basic safety equipment should include: first aid kit, fire extinguisher, CB radio, tow strap, extra food and water, basic tool kit, some spare parts, safety glasses, gloves, full size spare, working emergency brake.

Large Velcro straps are handy for keeping your straps together.

When you believe there is a chance of rolling over grab your seat belt and hold on. Do not grab the roll bar or reach out to stop your rig from rolling over.

If your gear is not tied down well then it will get thrown around.
