
As a club we recently began discussing "The hold harmless agreement" read about the most recent conversation on page 3.

California's State Vehicular Recreation Areas (SVRA).

Did you know that the State Parks Transformation Team is proposing to terminate the Off Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation Division and take all of its programs into State Parks without any plan or input from the public?

Did you know that California has 9 SVRA's operated by the OHMVR Division of State Parks? (Prairie City, Hollister Hills, Carnegie, Hungry Valley, Oceano Dunes, Ocotillo Wells, Heber Dunes, Clay Pit, East Kern-Onyx Ranch)

Did you know that the OHV program, which started in 1972 to Protect Public Lands, Manage OHV trails, provide for Environmental Restoration, provide for Education and Law Enforcement, has never used 1 cent of taxpayer dollars to fund the SVRA's or any of the other OHV programs?

Facts:

In 1971, two Assemblymen, an Off-Roader and an Environmentalist seeing the need for managed OHV recreation got together and wrote the Chappie-Z'Berg Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Law of 1971 which created California's OHV program to be managed by State Parks.

The OHV program funds grants outside of the SVRA's for trail maintenance and development, environmental protection and restoration, law enforcement, and education to nonprofits, local Sheriff's, County Parks, Native American Tribes, BLM and Forest Service pumping over \$500,000,000 into public lands and the State economy since 1972.

The State has forcefully Taken \$172,000,000+ from the OHV Trust Fund as "Loans" since 1972.

OHV fuel taxes collected from OHV users are now being Taken, not Loaned, but Taken for State Parks and the General Fund for a total of \$71,000,000 since 2011 including next year's budget. State Parks is counting on OHV funds to pay for fixing the sad condition of its own Parks through a "one-time" \$31,000,000 diversion of OHV gas taxes in the 2016/17 State budget.

The State has already Taken \$10,000,000 in "one-time" OHV gas tax takes each year since 2011. One time really means ongoing!

The OHV program has always been funded 100% through user paid fees and taxes specifically related to OHV recreation. No general tax dollars have ever been used for this program.

The OHV program budget is made up of Green/Red Sticker Off Highway Vehicle Registration fees, SVRA gate fees and OHV user-paid gas taxes.

The OHV program actually *pays* State Parks, CHP and DMV a portion of its user funded budget for administrative overhead and services provided.

Combining the OHV program and management of all SVRA's with other State Parks divisions is exactly the opposite way to fix a broken State Parks Department.

The OHV community and its user paid program are being taken advantage of and not receiving the truth from your public servants.

Now is the time to be heard!

DD hold harmless agreement

Kevin in a practicing attorney. His practice is primarily business and investments. He does contracts and brokerage agreements. He came up with a three-pronged system. There is no right or wrong way to do this. Kevin looked at what Inland Empire has online and it looks okay. There is nothing that is 100% protection but he tried to put something together that he would want to have in his hand if he was in front of a judge. His thoughts are to have all the members at membership or dues time to sign a waiver and release of liability as well as an agreemnt to indemnify the club and its officers.

Kevin tried to write it as broad as possible to try to give as much protection as possible. It is written to be continuing so that if someone misses a year, it is still good, but the plan is to sign it every year. He made a similar form for guests. Members would sign once a year and then sign the run record, but guests would have to fill out the form every time. The run record has a sign-in sheet that has a short waiver included for the members to sign. It has provisions stated that the driver will comply with registration, insurance, laws and club rules.

Will need to keep the information somewhere. Kevin is suggesting the hold harmless agreements be scanned digitally and uploaded to a password protected site i.e. Google Drive. They do not have sensitive information such as drivers license and social security numbers, so personal information is not a concern, but basic security is still recommended. It is suggested to keep the digital copies for a long time as there isn't any reason not keep them. The paper should be kept for a year and not destroyed until after the digital copies are created.

Question 1 should a "legal fund" be created, Kevin does not see the club maintaining the amount of money that would be required. He feels that insurance would be cost prohibitive. The club does not have officer/board insurance. Per Mike, it was researched last year and he called underwriters for our sport and the only thing that was available was for specific events or slip and fall. The specific policy is called D&O and Kevin does not feel that is necessary for a club this size and the amount of money that goes through the club.

Members need to review the documents and bring to a vote next month. Procedure will need to be developed.

Meeting Location: From LA/OC take the 15 Fwy North to Lenwood Rd exit. Turn right on Lenwood Rd., then left on Mercantile Way by the <u>76 gas station</u>. Pull into the <u>dirt area</u> <u>on the right</u> and look for the Jeeps. This meet spot is suitable for leaving tow vehicles and trailers.

GPS coordinates: N 34° 50.898", W 117° 04.866"

Meeting Time: 8:30 am

The objective is to pre-run the Devils Loop. This is the trail that the Dirt Devils lead for Cal 4 Wheel at the High Desert Roundup (HDR) in the Stoddard Valley OHV area.

Trail description: We will take a sandy wash from the meet spot to the start of the Devils Loop trail. The devils loop is a moderate trail located in the Stoddard Valley OHV area. The trail is considered moderate but has a few difficult sections. Most of these have a by-pass. The difficult sections are rocky with ledges that have steep drop-offs. There is also a steep hill climb and a squeeze. The trail has lots of rocks of all sizes and shapes.

We start the trail at the gate keeper. The gate-keeper is a (Dirt Devil made) rocky section at the beginning of the trail. The point of the gate-keeper is to test drivers and rigs: if you can't make it you should not continue.

After the gate-keeper, we will continue with the rest of the trail. This run will be much like an adopt-a-trail run with some trail marking and maintenance activities along the way.

The return trip to the Lenwood rd. meet spot is via the sandy wash. There are bypasses for all but one of the rocky obstacles.

Trail Rating: Moderate (see Dirt Devils Trail Ratings on our web site.) On a scale from 1 to 10 were 1 is a graded dirt road and 10 is the most difficult hammer trail. Devils Loop is a 6.

Special Equipment Required: 33 inch tires with at least one locker is recommended, Body/wheel damage is possible.

Reminder: Lunch, water, pry bars, shovels, gloves, trash bags camera, chair. etc.

Lunch: We will stop for lunch along the trail.

Saturday Trail: Silver/Wyman Canyons.(E) This is a west to east traverse of the White Mountains. Silver Canyon goes straight up the west side of the White Mountains. The trail has steep switchbacks up the Canyon and tops out at 10,000 ft. elev. With great views of the Sierra Nevada Mountains to the west. At the top we will visit the Patriarch Bristlecone Pine groves. We will leave to the east in Wyman canyon. Wyman canyon has several water crossings, a miner's cabin, small cattle ranch, and hopefully a small water fall along the route. This is an easy trail.

Sunday Trail: Coyote Flats is a high plateau 10K elev. above Bishop in the Sierra Nevada Mtn.. The trail has great views of Bishop, and the White mountains to the east. The first part of the trail is steep and near the top there is a short moderate section as the trail passes Sugarloaf peak. We have had trouble in this section on other runs. The secret here is stay away from the soft downhill side of the trail or you will get a cow bell. Once past the moderate section we continue through Coyote Flats to Rocky Bottom and Funnel lakes. I am hoping these lakes will be near full after all the rain and snow this year. We finish the trail on Coyote Flats rd just outside of Bishop

Special Equipment Required:

Saturday: Any stock 4 wheel drive vehicle with low gear and good ground clearance can run this trail.

Sunday: Recommend 33 inch tries, a least one locker, Skid plates and good ground clearance. This trail is not suitable for long wheelbase or stock vehicles.

Cowbells



The cow bell rules are: Cow bells are awarded from air down to air up. If you get stuck and are unable to move under your own power and need the help of a winch or you get strapped from one of your fellow jeepers then you have earned the privilege of hanging the cow bell from your front bumper. You must leave the cow bell on the front of your rig until another Dirt Devil gets stuck. Then you proudly hand it over. While on the trail, not on the highway to the trail.
